### **LATIN II: COURSE SYLLABUS/OVERVIEW**

Latin II builds right off of Latin I. It starts with an extensive grammar review and moves right into passive voice. After passive voice we study verbals, deponent verbs, pronouns, adjectives, and adverbs. Latin II grammar then proceeds to indirect statement, irregular verbs, and the subjunctive mood. By the end of Latin II, almost all of Latin grammar is covered.

During the year there is a broad study of new vocabulary to help expand student's modern vocabulary usage. Also, the new vocabulary helps students to prepare for the new translations that are covered. During Latin II students study Julius Caesar and do a more extensive research into the history of the kingdom, republic, and empire. Several famous Roman stories and many of Caesar's own commentaries are translated.

The Roman language and culture greatly affected the western world, and Latin II explores that in a much deeper level since students now have a base from Latin I.

#### **What you can expect from me:**

- I will treat you with respect and I value your thoughts.
- I will be firm but fair with you.
- I will do anything I can to help you to succeed!
- My classroom will be opened by me at 7:15 every morning.
- I pray to reflect Christ's character to you.
- If there is a broken expectation, I will let you know that I am aware of it. I will deal with you individually to resolve it. (The tardy/cell phone/ and dress code rules have consequences already established. I will uphold those and consider those violations in my class as disrespect to me.)

#### **What I expect from you: I expect you...**

- To become effective learners and communicators.
- To always come prepared, ready to learn. No late work is accepted.
- To be respectful to others in and out of class. Do not interrupt anyone speaking. Raise your hand and/or wait to be called to speak. (I encourage you to voice your thoughts and ask questions, respectfully!)
- To be in your seat and ready to work when the bell rings and To be in dress code.
- If absent (or late), to bring in note and get assignments from me. (1 day out / 1 day make-up, etc.)

#### **What you do need for class!**

- 3 ring binder, 4 dividers (**Grammar, History, Translation, Vocabulary**), and loose leaf paper in back.

**What you do not need for class.**
